Holiday Schedule - September 6th, November 25th, and May 30th. Please note that Christmas and New Years will not result in a delay.

Whenever a scheduled collection day falls on a holiday, that day's collection and all remaining collections for the week will be delayed one day. Friday collection will be on Saturday. Holidays are marked in green.

Place your [recyclable materials only](#) in your Blue Box, and set it out at the curb according to the calendar above. All trash and recyclables **must** be out at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day. Reusable rubbish containers and recycling bins must be removed from the curb as soon as possible but no later than 1:00 am on the following day of scheduled collection.

The "Yes and No" of What Can Go In the Recycling Boxes

YES

- Aluminum-** Empty and rinse. [cans, foil, pie pans](#)
- Steel (tin) cans-** Empty and Rinse. Labels need not be removed [food and beverage cans, pet food cans](#)
- Glass-** Empty and rinse. Discard lids in trash. Labels need not be removed. [food and beverage bottles and jars](#)
- Plastics-** ONLY containers smaller than 2 gallons are recyclable. Empty and rinse. Discard caps in trash. [food containers: margarine, yogurt, cooking oil, soda and water containers, milk, juice, shampoo, etc.](#)
- Cartons-** Empty, rinse & flatten. Recycle with containers not paper. [milk and juice cartons, soymilk and drink boxes.](#)
- Paper-** Clean paper only. Flatten boxes. Windows in envelopes are ok... [newspaper, inserts, magazines, junk mail, white and colored paper, corrugated cardboard, boxboard \(for example, cereal boxes\)](#)



NO

- Aluminum-** siding, scrap, foil-wrapped beverage pouches
- Steel-** hangers, toys, appliances, aerosol spray cans, pipes, pots and pans, fuel tanks, car parts and scrap metal.
- Glass-** ceramics, baking dishes, coffee mugs, mirrors, vases, glass art, windows, eye glasses, light bulbs, plate glass, drinking glasses ect...
- Plastics-** styrofoam (polystyrene) take out food containers, cups, plates, utensils, straws, bags, food packing (e.g., candy bar, cookies, pasta) frozen food bags/pouches, meat trays, egg cartons, medicine and pill bottles, clothes baskets, toys, flower pots, black plastic, buckets, VCR, CD cases, tarps, containers with motor oil, pesticides, anti-freeze, pool chemicals or any other harmful chemicals, PVC piping, furniture, swimming pools,
- Cartons-** foil-wrapped pouches, frozen juice cartons, frozen food packing
- Paper-** soda, beer cartons, cups, paper towels, tissue, hard cover books, stickers & sticker sheeting, dirty paper (pet waste, paint)
